Supply Chain

The entire system of producing and delivering a product or service, from sourcing the raw materials to the final delivery of the product to end-users.


Food Value Chain

A business model in which producers and buyers of agricultural products form **strategic alliances with other supply chain**, such as aggregators, processors, distributors, retailers, and consumers, **to enhance financial returns through product differentiation that advances social or environmental goals**. -Diamond et al. 2014 Value chains offer opportunities for local development through <u>entrepreneurship</u> that focuses on <u>creating</u> <u>specialty and value-added</u> <u>products</u> and use innovative marketing techniques to <u>reconnect producers and</u> <u>consumers.</u>

- Many national companies are vertically integrated, have high throughput, and are cost efficient.
- Short value chains are competitive because the players are coordinated, which allows them to reduce risk, share resources, manage costs, and reduce costly errors.
- Short value chains are most successful when there is trust between parties, which is most likely to exist in small communities.
